The regular membership meeting of the Crescent City Coin Club, on March 20, 2013 was called to order by President Rick Demers at 7:08 pm.. President Rick Demers welcomed new members of the club that were present. President Demers mentioned to the

club that our club coin show is coming up on April 13th & 14th and would like for club members to help with the show. President Demers thanked Mr. Bob Eddy **III & Patti Bennett for** their work in negotiating with the hotel Double Tree, in the reduction of the coin show hall, which will save the club money in the long run for the space availability. President Demers advised the club members that in the past we housed about 30 to 32 tables per coin show and that we will still be able to house 35 tables for the next coin show.

Coin Auction



Members are encouraged to bring coins for auction. Coins will be auctioned toward the end of each monthly meeting. Members are permitted to set starting bid price on each coin put on the auction block. Club members are able to auction up to 5 coins each.

President Demers mentioned to the club that this is using the same hall but only having a partition to separate the size of the hall smaller.

Vice President Nick Lagattuta talked about the upcoming ANA show. He mentioned that the show is almost sold out, in which there is between 350 to 400 tables sold at this time. He also mentioned that in the upcoming weeks the advertisement base will increase for the show event He also passed out coupons that will save \$2.00 for non ANA members to go to the coin show event as well as posters for advertisement. Vice President Lagattuta passed out a copy of the magazine The Numismatist which showed on page 74 & 75 his article about some local eateries within the surrounding area of the ANA show at the **Morial Convention Center.** This was a very good article displaying some of the local area restaurants. Vice President Lagattuta mentioned that the WWII Museum will

also have displays on hand showing coins representing the ANA show. Vice President Lagattuta advised club members that those members who will help with the ANA show that by April meeting, he will have the work assignments listed for them. He also mentioned that the opening day of the ANA show he will have a New Orleans flavor for the opening ceremony such as a jazz band greeting all show attendee's.

French: Flower of the Die (FDC)

A perfect or virtually perfect coin. Fully struck up. No Contact- or other Detracting Marks visible with the naked eye, and only minute superficial imperfections, relating to the manufacturing process rather than any other cause, may be visible under magnification. Fully Lustre or Mint Bloom is present. Toning on Silver coins (if present) must be attractive. Brilliance (Color) on Bronze Coins should be 90% plus. Eye Appeal is outstanding. To reiterate, it is a completely flawless mint state coin with nothing forgiven. This grade is very rare, not to be taken lightly or accepted easily.

President Rick Demers called the meeting to order @ 7:05 pm. A motion by Ruth Young and seconded by Bruce Ehrman to dispense the reading of the previous Board Meeting minutes, all were in favor motion passes.

Treasurer report Mike Buras absent at tonight's meeting. Mr. Bob Eddy mentioned that \$2,300.00 was the cost of the Double Tree Hotel for the next upcoming show. President Rick Demers also talked about getting the signature cards straighten up for the clubs checking account.

President Rick Demers also talked about getting the membership meeting programs lined up for the upcoming meeting's and Ruth Young advised that the TV and CD are ok and that the sound system is up and running also.

Corresponding Sec. Steve Rogers also mentioned that he is working on an updated list of e-mails and will ask the members at the next Membership Meeting for their e-mail address.

Recording Secretary Linton Duet Jr. give President Rick Demers a list of all members up to date as far as their address and phone numbers as well as their member number.

There was a discussion about name tags in which at the upcoming CCCC show work-

ers as well as dealers, the club would like for them to have name tags present. President Rick Demers advise he will handle that matter. President Rick Demers thanked Mr. Bob Eddy and Patti Bennett for their work in helping the club reduce the cost of the hall at the Double Tree Hotel for the next upcoming coin show. The club will save \$ 400.00 for this next show which is in April 2013 and \$ 800.00 per following shows for the rest of this year. President Rick Demers advised that this would not effect the amount of tables sold since we usually only sell 30 to 33 tables. He also advised that he feels that we can put 35 or 36 tables within that area saving the club money per show event.

Ruth Young talked about for the summer having Junior Members participate for club shows and meetings since school will be out for the summer.

Mr. Bob Eddy talked about advertisement for the club shows within the Times Picayune and other available coverage areas. President Rick Demers mentioned other different means of advertisement trying to attract areas like Houma, Gulfport, Gonzales, & Baton Rouge areas through different newspapers and the radio stations. Recording Secretary Linton Duet Jr. brought up a document from the City of Kenner giving the club the opportunity to place signs on a temporary bases for the clubs upcoming coin show. Bruce Ehrman also mentioned that the club does have a couple of signs still from the time they use to place them out for previous coin shows. President Rick Demers signed the City of Kenner document for a temporary sign application.

Vice President Nick Lagattuta talked about the upcoming ANA show in May 2013, advising that the show has been sold out. He also advised that at the April CCCC Meeting he will start to give out job duties to members who will work the ANA show. VP Nick Lagattuta mentioned that he has a Jazz Band playing at the ANA show at the opening ceremonies from 9:15 am. until 9:45 am. and that between 9:45 and 10:00 am. will be the ribbon cutting
