2012 Star-Spangled Banner Coins Released

The United States Mint ceremoniously released the Star-Spangled Banner Commemorative Coins today at Fort Mc Henry National Monument and Historic Shrine. Speakers included Daniel Shaver, US Mint Chief Counsel and Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley. Other dignitaries in attendance were U.S. Senator Ben Cardin and U.S. Representatives C.A. Dutch Ruppersberger and John Sarbanes.

The Star-Spangled Banner Commemorative Coin Program celebrates the bicentennial writing of the national anthem by Francis Scott Key. Designs on



the commemorative coins are emblematic of the Battle of Baltimore during the War of 1812, and in particular, the flag that inspired Key to pen his famous words.

Two Dead, One Injured After Coin Robbery

Louisiana State Police Crime Laboratory experts were going over a damaged safe looking for evidence that might connect it to the robbery-killings that left two dead and one critically injured in Gonzales, La.

Deputies found three people Feb. 18 with their throats slashed in their Gonzales home.

The apparent motive was a safe containing a collection of gold coins valued at an estimated \$500,000, which was taken from the home. None of the other valuables in the house were missing.

The Advocate newspaper reports

Livingston Parish authorities recovered a safe Feb. 20 that matches descriptions family members gave of the missing safe that contained the gold coins.
